On behalf of Cure 4 The Kids Foundation (C4K), I am writing to express my strong support for Assembly Bill 248, which would ratify Nevada's participation in the Physical Therapy Licensure Compact (PT Compact).

As the Founder and Chief Advocacy & Innovation Officer of C4K, I have seen firsthand the essential role that physical therapist (PTs) and physical therapist assistants (PTAs) play in providing rehabilitative care for children facing serious medical conditions, including those undergoing cancer treatment and other complex therapies. Ensuring timely access to qualified PTAs is critical to improving patient outcomes, and A.B. 248 will help achieve that goal.

By allowing Nevada to join the PT Compact, A.B. 248 will:

- Expand access to care by allowing licensed PTs and PTAs from other compact states to practice in Nevada without additional licensing barriers.
- Strengthen Nevada's healthcare workforce by reducing administrative burdens, making it easier to recruit and retain top talent.
- Support continuity of care by facilitating cross-state mobility, which is particularly beneficial for families who travel for medical treatment.
