



**TESTIMONY OF AARP NEVADA BEFORE THE SENATE
COMMITTEE ON GROWTH AND INFRASTRUCTURE, 4/7/2025**

AARP Nevada is pleased to support SB 442 which requires Nevada's Public Utilities Commission to implement regulations for monthly reporting on utility service terminations to enhance transparency and protect residential customers' health.

AARP represents persons over 50 many of whom struggle to make ends meet including paying their utility bill.

Specifically, Senate Bill 442 mandates the Public Utilities Commission of Nevada to establish regulations requiring public utilities to submit monthly reports on the termination of utility services to residential customers.

This will enhance transparency and protect residential customers' health by ensuring utilities provide necessary information on service terminations.

Additionally, the bill maintains existing regulations that require utilities to postpone service termination if it threatens the health of residents and mandates notice posting for tenants if a landlord fails to pay for utility services.

These common sense consumer protections are a good idea because they will allow our regulators and the public to know the extent of utility terminations. They will also allow postponement of terminations including if the landlord fails to pay their utility bill.

We strongly support this legislation and thank you for reviewing our testimony in favor of SB442.
